In a world where cargo theft is on the rise and cargo thieves are both creative and committed, simply calling the police is not enough to recover stolen cargo - even when you have a GPS device.







Overhaul Response Success Stories

Location: De Motte, Indiana (Origin: Louisville, KY) Incident: Full Truckload Theft, Recovery, and Arrest

On August 31st at approximately 8AM local time, a tractor and trailer filled with consumer electronics was stolen from a truck stop in De Motte, IN.

The shipment had staged overnight at the truck stop, which was approximately 250 miles from origin in Louisville, KY, and the entire rig was stolen when the driver left it unattended in the morning.

The tractor and trailer were taken approximately 30 miles south to Remington, IN where it was parked at a truck stop, repowered with a different tractor, and the trailer license plate was replaced and its markings were covered by paint and new number decals applied before heading south again, all within 25 minutes.

The driver noticed his rig missing before the cargo arrived in Remington and notified the Jasper County Sherriff and the Overhaul GSOC of the theft. The Overhaul Response team was activated and engaged the Indiana State Police as well as the Remington and Lebanon Police Departments.

As the shipment headed south, Indiana SP was in pursuit, being provided up-to-the-minute locations via Overhaul's platform, and Lebanon PD set up along the highway to intercept.



Location: Southern California

Incident: Recoveries and Shell Game Tactics

On Thursday, April 28, Overhaul recovered two client shipments, with the cooperation of our law enforcement partners in Southern California. During our response, we also successfully recovered an additional stolen shipment of like products for a non-client global manufacturer. These incidents are tied to the same ring of cargo thieves currently operating in Southern California.

Through careful coordination and surveillance, Overhaul determined that these thieves were moving entire loads directly from one trailer to another to confuse any potential investigation. They accomplished this while in a secured truck parking lot by backing the trailers tail to tail. Utilizing a hand pallet jack, they had wholly shifted at least 2 shipments between 3 trailers. Additionally, both drivers involved were using stolen Commercial Drivers Licenses (CDL).

This ring is targeting televisions from multiple manufacturers and distribution centers in the area. They stole at least 6 shipments between March and April 2023, and the true number is likely higher.
